CUSTOMS	MEMORANDUM	ORDER

To: All District/Fort Collectors of Customs Chiefs, Bonds Division, Collection Division and Accounting Division and Others Concerned

Republic Act No. 7835 otherwise known as the Comprehensive and Integrated Shelter Financing Act (CISFA), enhanced and intensified the National Shelter Program (NSP). The pertinent provision under Section 10 (E) of CISFA is quoted as follows:

"Section 10. Fund Sources. - The National Government is hereby mandated to allocate and appropriate the necessary funds for the continuing requirements of this Act, including whatever funds which may be available from, but not limited to, the following sources."

"(E) Proceeds from forfeited customs bond."

All Chiefs of the Bonds Division and Collection Division are required to submit to the Accounting Division reports on the proceeds from forfeited customs bond supported with official receipts.

Dear Commissioner Parayno;

The National Shelter Program (HSP) is one of the flagship programs of the Ramos Administration. It aims to deliver 1.2 million housing assistance within the period 1003-1008 as contained in the Medium Term Philippine Development Plan (MITPDP).

The passage of Republic Act No. 7835 otherwise known as the Comprehensive and Integrated Shelter Financing Act (CISFA) of 1994, enhanced and intensified the NSP. The Act identified the various programs and projects for implementation vital to the realization of the NSP objectives. It also enumerates the required appropriation from the National Government (NG). In addition to the NG financial support to the program, other fund sources like "proceeds from forfeited customs bonds" is considered. The pertinent provision under Section 10 (E) of CISEA is quoted as follows:

> "Section 10, Fund Sources. - The National Government is hereby mandated to allocate and appropriate the necessary funds for the continuing requirements of this Act, including whatever funds which may be available from, but not limited to, the following sources."

"(E) Proceeds from forfeited customs bonds."

Relative thereto, please advise this Department of the amount released allocated for the housing sector in 1995, 1996 and your estimates for 1997 pursuant to the above provision of CISFA law. We look forward to your continued support to the realization of the National Shelter Program.
