e. April 08 (Saturday) - Black Saturday

f. April 10 (Monday nearest April 9) - Araw ng Kagitingan

g. May 01 (Monday) - Labor Day

h. June 12 (Monday) - Independence Day

i. August 21 (Monday) - Ninoy Aguino Day

i. August 28 (Monday) National Heroes Day

k. November 01 (Wednesday) - All Saints' Day

I. November 27 (Monday nearest November 30) - Bonifacio Day

m. December 08 (Friday) - Feast of the Immaculate Conception of Mary

n. December 30 (Saturday) - Rizal Day

December 31 (Sunday) – Last Day of the Year
