SUBJECT: MORATORIUM ON THE ACCEPTANCE OF FORFEITED USED CLOTHING BY THE DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WELFARE AND DEVELOPMENT (DSWD)

Pursuant to various requests to donate seized/forfeited used clothing from our ports to DSWD, please be informed that the declared Moratorium on the Acceptance of Forfeited Used Clothing, as stated in a Memorandum of the Honorable Secretary Corazon J. Soliman dated o8 August 2011, is still in force as of this date. Requests for donations shall be denied except for those with approved Deed of Donation and Acceptance prior to the issuance of this Customs Memorandum Circular (CMC).

For your information and guidance please see attached Memorandum from the Honorable Secretary Corazon J. Soliman and the letter from Mateo G. Montaño, Officer-in-Charge, DSWD dated 08 August 2011 and 22 September 2014, respectively.


We hope this clarifies your query.
