CUSTOMS MEMORANDUM  
ORDER NO. 49-93

TO: All District Collector of Customs  
Collectors of Customs, Service Directors,  
Division Chiefs, Importers, Customs  
Brokers and Other Concerned.

SUBJECT: Extension of the use of the Old Import  
Entry and Internal Revenue Declaration  
(IEIRD, No. 236), for Consumption and  
Warehousing and the Permit to Deliver  
Imported Goods (PDIG, No. 194) forms.

---

In order to put to use as many of the old IEIRD and PDIG forms purchased and are still in the possession of the importers, customs brokers and other declarants, their use, originally set to be stopped on 30 September 1993 pursuant to CMO 39-93, is hereby extended as follows:

1. For Customs Districts II-A, II-B, III, IV and VII, up to October 30, 1993.
2. For Customs Districts I, V, VI, VIII, IX, X, XI and XII, up to November 30 1993.

At the end of the extended periods provided above, the old forms shall be withdrawn from use, and all sets and pads still in the possession of the users shall be returned to the Supply/Accountable Officer of the District, duly noted and, together with the unsold sets and pads, be sent to the General


Services Division in Manila for replacement. The revised forms received as replacements shall then be distributed accordingly without additional cost to the users.

The revised form which was authorized for use starting on 16 September 1993 shall be used where the old form is not available to the entry filer during the transition period and, thereafter, exclusively as a matter of course, provided that:

1. The EDIG form shall be used only with the old form.
2. No further sale of the old form and the EDIG shall be made.
3. Requisitions for the revised form shall be made immediately to cover the requirements of each port, together with an estimate of its requirements for the next six months.

The Transitory Provisions of CMO 39-93 is hereby amended accordingly.

All concerned shall be guided accordingly.
