CUSTOMS MEMORANDUM ORDER

NO. 6-96

TO : All District Collectors and Others Concerned

SUBJECT : Additional Instructions to CMO 117-92

Further to Customs Memorandum Order 117-92, dated 06 November 1992, entitled "Treatment of Shipments Owned, Consigned and/or Being Followed up by Persons or Entities Claiming/Representing Relationship with the Commissioner of Customs," everyone is hereby ordered not to transact any Customs matter with any person with the surname PARAYNO or presenting himself to be my relative unless a written clearance issued by the undersigned can be presented.

The presence of such person in any office or area within the jurisdiction of the Bureau of Customs must be questioned and demand must be made for his access pass. If the person cannot present any, he should be immediately escorted out of Customs premises. Any application for pass must be referred to the undersigned. Any transaction/shipment wherein such individual's name is being used by should be immediately reported to the Office of the Commissioner (tel. 527-45-70) or to the Chief, Enforcement and Security Service (49-13-18/49-13-92). Such transaction /shipment must be held immediately by Customs authorities until cleared by the Commissioner in writing himself.
