Customs Memorandum Order

To: All District/Port Collector Service/Division Chiefs Others Concerned

Subject: Amendment to Sections II.1.2 and II.1.3.1 of CMO 39-91

I. Sections II.1.2 and II.1.3.1 of CMO 39-91 are hereby amended to read as follows:

II.1.2. Requirements for accreditation of subcontractor

A firm may be accredited as a subcontractor of a bonded manufacturing warehouse by filing an application with the Collector of Customs having jurisdiction over the warehouse accompanied with the following documents:

- 1. A photocopy of the SEC Certificate of Registration, Articles of Incorporation and By-laws. In case of partnershipor single proprietorship, the Certificate of Registration with the Bureau of Domestic Trade.
- 2. Audited or Interim Financial Statement for the last two years immediately preceding the date of application. (Preferably a copy submitted to the BIR)
- 3. Applicant's Income Tax Return for the last two years immediately preceding the date of application. If a corporation or partnership, in addition, the income tax return of the majority stock holders/partners during the same period. (Not applicable to new corporation or partnership).
- 4. Service agreement.
- II.1.2.1 Inspection of the proposed factory maybe dispensed with prothe operator of the bonded manufacturing warehouse in conformity with the subcontractor submits a notarized waiver (Annex "A") that it will not claim for abatement under Sec. 1704 in case of loss, injury, damage or destruction of the raw materials, accessories or finished articles of whatever cause, occurrence or circumstance, natural or man-made. Instead duties and taxes shall immediately be paid equivalent to the materials, accessories or finished articles lost, injured, damaged or destroyed.

- II.1.2.2. The clearance required from other offices in the Bureau is hereby abolished.
- II-1-3-1 Requirements for accreditation for membership to a Common Bonded Manufacturing/Trading Warehouse.

A person, natural or juridical, who is an export producer may apply for membership to a common bonded manufacturing/trading warehouse by filing an application with the District Collector of Customs having jurisdiction over the warehouse accompanied with above documents and in addition the following:

1. List of raw materials to be imported.

2. Formula of manufacture certified by the Industrial Technology Development Institute. In case of garment, the formula approved by GTEB.

3. Brochure or label of products to be manufactured.

- II.1.3.2. Inspection of the proposed factory maybe dispensed with provided the operator of the common bonded manufacturing/trading warehouse in conformity with the prospective member submits a notarized waiver (Annex "A") under the same condition as in Section II.1.2.1 hereof.
- II.1.3.3 The clearance required from other offices in the Bureau is hereby abolished.
