
CUSTOMS MEMORANDUM ORDER
NO. 31-92

TO: All District Collectors of Customs and
All Others Concerned

In line with the present thrust to generate more revenues for the government, and to expedite processing of the requests for redemption pursuant to E.O. No. 38 and CAO No. 10-91, all District Collectors and all offices under his supervision and control are hereby given a total period of fifteen (15) days from receipt of such request, to evaluate whether the request is meritorious or not, to prepare the computation of redemption value, and to forward the papers to the Deputy Commissioner for Revenue Collection and Monitoring Group with an accompanying favorable or unfavorable recommendation, as the case may be. For this purpose, the District Collector is hereby given a free hand to determine the maximum period a particular Division in his Collection District should act on the matter so long as there is compliance with the total period aforesaid. Furthermore, the District Collector may impose the appropriate sanction against the Customs Officials and/or employees responsible for not meeting the specified period within which they should perform the tasks relative to the request for redemption.

Finally, all District Collectors of Customs are hereby instructed to see to it that this Order is strictly complied with by all Customs officials and employees under his supervision and control.

This Order shall take effect immediately.
