



We are writing your good office regarding the recent requests from the Bureau of Customs regarding rice imports abandoned and held in the ports of entry. We would like to inform you that DA-Department Circular No. 4, series of 2016 *Guidelines on the Importation of Plants, Planting Materials and Plant Products for Commercial Purposes* and Presidential Decree 1433, as amended also known as the *Plant Quarantine Law of 1978* are enforced by the Bureau of Plant Industry. Existing rules and regulations require that importation of plants, planting materials and plant products including grains be accompanied by **Sanitary and Phytosanitary Import Clearance (SPSIC).**

In light of the recently passed Republic Act 11023 also known as *An Act Liberalizing the Importation, Exportation and Trading of Rice, Lifting for the Purpose the Quantitative Import Restriction on Rice, and For Other Purposes,* all importation of rice, wheat and grains must be accompanied by an SPSIC and must comply with food safety and plant quarantine rules. We request that this information be also circulated to all ports and all customs inspectors for their guidance and cooperation.

Thank you very much and we hope to continuously collaborate with your office in facilitating trade and at the same time protecting our borders from sanitary and phytosanitary risks.
