#### OBJECTIVE:

To provide a venue for the speedy and expeditious resolution of all complaints/questions against the report/findings of the SGS on classification and the applicability, comparability and correctness of published values.

### II. ORGANIZATION:

There is hereby created a BOC-SGS Appeals Committee II under the Office of the Commissioner which shall be composed of the following:

### III. JURISDICTION:

The Committee shall have jurisdiction relative questions/disputes:

1. Arising from SGS classification as reported in the SGS-CRF.

2. On the applicability, comparability and correctness of published values.

## IV. POWERS AND DUTIES:

The Committee shall exercise the following powers and duties:

1. To meet regularly at least twice a week to study, evaluate and deliberate all complaints against the findings/reports of the SGS on classification as reflected in the Clean Report of Findings (CRF) and the applicability, comparability and correctness of published values.

2. To summon parties for the clarificatory questions, as the need arises.

- To resolve immediately all complaints/questions on classification and applicability, comparability and correctness of published values and submit its findings and recommendations to the Commissioner of Customs for approval.
- 4. Once approved by the Commissioner of Customs, to transmit its findings and resolutions to the District Collector concerned for implementation.
