GREETINGS!

WHEREAS, the above-described articles were brought into the Philippines by incoming passenger Diwata E. Opoc who arrived at NAIA Terminal 1 on June 28, 2021 on board Philippine Airlines (PAL) Flight 105 from San Francisco, USA;

WHEREAS, the subject articles were discovered after passenger Opoc passed her luggage through x-ray for inspection, thus, it was marked with "X" by XIP Inspector Guillermo Catanaoan;

WHEREAS, passenger Opoc and her luggage was referred to Hirosika F. Liscano, Acting Customs Examiner, who informed her that his luggage was marked with "X", so it will be subjected to 100% physical examination. She also inquired if she has anything to declare, and she replied in the negative. Customs Examiner Liscano requested passenger Opoc for her Passport and Customs Baggage Declaration Form, and after going over them, she then proceeded with the actual examination of her luggage;

WHEREAS, the actual examination of the luggage of passenger Opoc yielded the following articles:

- Twenty four (24) pieces Sunscreen Lotion
- Thirty (30) sets Dental Tool Kits

WHEREAS, the above-described articles were turned over to the In Bond Room under Held Baggage Receipt (HBR) No. 00542464 for safekeeping;

WHEREAS, in a Memorandum dated June 28, 2021, Acting Customs Examiner Hirosika F. Liscano, with the concurrence of Sahlee Ysa-al, Flight Supervisor, Elizabeth B. Pableo, Chief, Arrival Operations Division, and Atty. Ma. Lourdes V. Mangaoang, Deputy Collector for Passenger Service, reported to the District Collector, this Port, her findings and recommended that subject articles be seized for lack of Import Permit/Clearance from the Food and Drug Administration pursuant to Republic Act (RA) 9711, otherwise known as the Food and Drug Administration Act;

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WHEREAS, after a careful evaluation of the documents submitted and applicable customs laws, rules and regulations, the NAIA District Collector finds probable cause for the issuance of Warrant of Seizure and Detention against the subject shipment for violation of Section 1113 in relation to Section 117 of RA No. 10863 otherwise known as the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA) and RA No. 9711 otherwise known as Food and Drug Administration Act;

WHEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested by law in this Office, and in compliance with applicable customs laws, rules and regulations, it is hereby ordered and decreed that the Twenty four (24) pieces of Sunscreen Lotions, and Thirty (30) sets of Dental Tool Kits brought in by incoming passenger Diwata E. Opoc be, as it is hereby ordered seized for violation of Section 1113 in relation to Section 117 of RA No. 10863 otherwise known as the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA) and RA No. 9711 otherwise known as Food and Drug Administration Act, to be turned over to the Auction and Cargo Disposal Division, this Port, for inventory, classification and valuation of goods pursuant to Section 1120 of the CMTA, and custody and safekeeping pursuant to CAO 10-2020, pending the resolution of the seizure case by the Law Division, and/or until ordered by the District Collector, this Port.

Compliance with Customs Memorandum Order No. 10-2020, particularly on the matter of making a return of service and the submission of the Inventory Report or list of the articles seized is to be strictly observed.

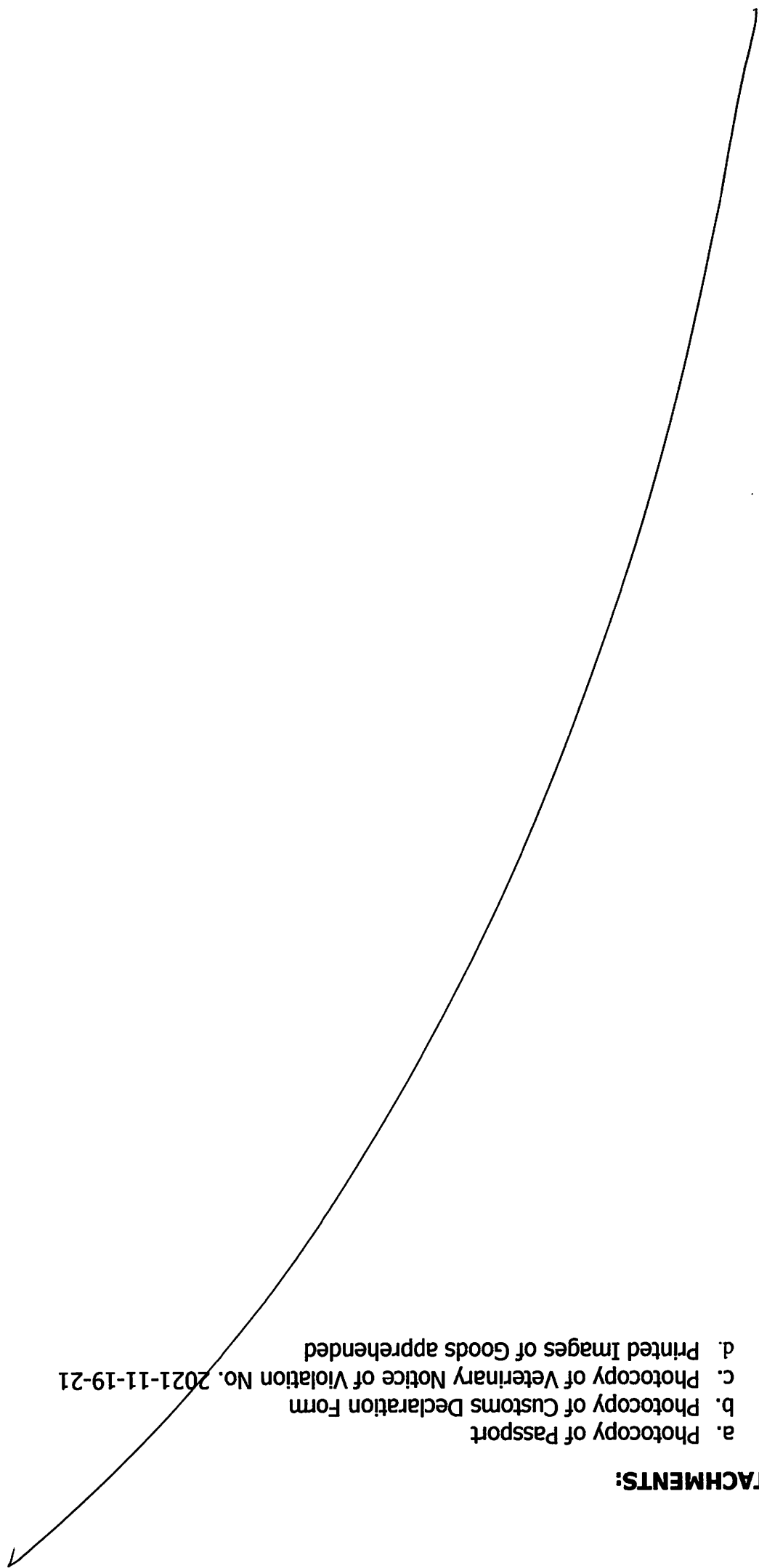
DISCUSSIONS:

Opoc, with passport number P5966234B, on board PR 105 from San Francisco, USA after her checked-in baggage was marked with "x" by XIP operator Guillermo Catanaoan.
- 3. Before conducting the physical examination, the Customs Examiner courteously approached the crew and informed her that her bag has "X" mark and are

4. The Customs Examiner asked if Ms. Opoc had anything to declare to which she replied in the negative. Likewise, she did not declare any goods in her CBDF.

FINDINGS:

5. Customs Examiner's Findings - Physical yielded and resulted to the discovery of the following:
 - Twenty Four (24) pieces of Sunscreen Lotions; and
 - Thirty (30) sets of Dental Tool Kits.

ACTION TAKEN:

6. Discovered goods were then held for presentation of Food and Drugs Administration (FDA) permits. Held Baggage Receipt (HBR) was issued to the crew with HBR No. 00542464 and the goods were turned over to the In-bond Unit, Baggage Assistance Division for safekeeping.

B. DIRECTIVE/RATIONALE FOR SUBMISSION OF THE INCIDENT REPORT

- a. Pursuant to the Memorandum dated June 20, 2019 of the Deputy Collector for Passenger Service to submit an Incident Report on Seizures of regulated goods not covered by Import Clearances

II. DISCUSSION:

A. NARRATION OF FACTS

1. On November 19, 2021 at about 2320H, at Terminal 1, the baggage of a female Filipino passenger named ANASTACIA C. PUNO with passport number P7414587B on board JL 745 from Narita, Japan was marked with "X" by XIP Operator Mohamad Jonaid M. Udasan and was referred to the above-signed Customs Examiner.
2. Before conducting the physical examination, the examiner asked the passenger if she accomplished a Customs Baggage Declaration Form (CBDF) and if she had anything to declare. The passenger answered in the negative and handed out her passport and the accomplished CBDF. The Examiner saw that said passenger ticked "no" to all items pertaining to page 3 of said form. The Examiner then proceeded to the examination.

B. FINDINGS:

3. Customs Examiner's Findings - Physical examination yielded and resulted to the discovery of Sixteen (16) kilograms of Fresh Frozen Beef Ribeye with an estimated value of \$700.

C. RELEVANT CUSTOMS AND RELATED LAWS, RULES AND REGULATIONS VIOLATED

4. Lack of Import Permit in violation of Department of Agriculture Administrative Order No. 18 Series of 2000, Department of Agriculture Administrative Order No. 09 Series of 2010, and related Department of Agriculture (DA) and Bureau of Animal Industry (BAI) laws, rules and regulations.

D. ACTION TAKEN:

5. The examined goods were then referred to the on-duty Quarantine Officer Mr. Marco/Edgardo A. Padilla (Bureau of Animal Industry). The Quarantine Officer thereafter confiscated the goods after said passenger failed to present the required import permit/clearance. Veterinary Notice of Violation No. 2021-11-19-21 was issued to the passenger.

III. RECOMMENDATION

6. Confiscation of the goods.
