This is to inform everyone that there is now a ban on the importation of Live Cattle, Meat and Meat Products due to the outbreak of Atypical Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) or Mad Cow Disease from **Brazil**.

All Districts Collectors and Sub-port Collectors and all others concerned are directed to coordinate with DA-BAI personnel should there be any importation of live cattle, meat and meat products from Brazil.

SUBJECT: TEMPORARY BAN ON THE IMPORTATION OF LIVE CATTLE, MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM CATTLE FROM BRAZIL

WHEREAS, it shall be the utmost objective of the Government to protect its borders and territories from the entry, establishment and spread of animal diseases that may be introduced by the importation of disease-carrying, contaminated, and/or adulterated meat and/or meat products, which endanger the lives and safety/health of the consuming public and which could pose risk to human and animal health and life and potentially cause serious economic consequences;

WHEREAS, the veterinary authorities of Brazil reported to the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) an outbreak of Atypical Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) in the states of Mato Grosso and Minas Gerais, Brazil last 3 September 2021;

WHEREAS, BSE is a zoonotic disease and there are studies showing that the atypical type of BSE or Mad Cow Disease may pose a risk to consumers due to BSE's assumed link with the variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (vCJD) in humans;

WHEREAS, Section 10 of Republic Act no. 10611, or the "Food Safety Act of 2013", provided that *in specific circumstances when the available relevant information for use in risk assessment is insufficient to show that a certain type of food or food product does not pose a risk to consumer health, precautionary measures shall be adopted*;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM D. DAR, Secretary, Department of Agriculture, by the powers vested in me by law, do hereby institute the following measures for the importation of meat and meat by products derived from cattle from Brazil:

1. Temporary suspension of the processing, evaluation of the application and issuance of the Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Import Clearance of meat and meat by products derived from cattle including live cattle importation;
2. All shipments IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT before the official communication of this Order to the Brazilian authorities shall be allowed **provided the slaughter and production date is on or before August 31, 2021**;
3. All previously approved SPS Import Clearances which were not yet IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT after the official communication of this Order to the Brazilian authorities are hereby REVOKED;
4. Shipments with ship out date after the communication of this Order to the Brazilian Authorities shall be dealt with as per DA Administrative Order 9 series of 2010, Section IV.D;
5. More rigorous and tight inspection on all arrivals of meat and meat by-products derived from cattle including live cattle by DA Veterinary Quarantine Officers assigned at ports of entry.

This **ORDER** shall take effect immediately.
