We refer to our memorandum issued on 21 September 2021 regarding the ban on the importation of live cattle, meat and meat products derived from cattle from Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) or Mad Cow Disease.

The countries affected by BSE now includes **United Kingdom**.

All Districts Collectors and Sub-port Collectors and all others concerned are directed to coordinate with DA-BAI personnel should there be any importation of live cattle, meat and meat products from Brazil and United Kingdom.

MEMORANDUM ORDER No. <u>60</u> Series of 2021

SUBIECT:

TEMPORARY BAN ON THE IMPORTATION OF LIVE CATTLE, MEAT AND MEAT PRODUCTS DERIVED FROM CATTLE FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM

WHEREAS, it shall be the utmost objective of the Government to protect its borders and territories from the entry, establishment and spread of animal diseases that may be introduced by the importation of disease-carrying, contaminated, and/or adulterated meat and/or meat products, which endanger the lives and safety/health of the consuming public and which could pose risk to human and animal health and life and potentially cause serious economic consequences;

WHEREAS, the veterinary authorities of the United Kingdom reported to the World Organisation for Animal Health (OIE) an outbreak of Classical Bovine Spongiform Encephalopathy (BSE) in the county of Somerset, South West England, United Kingdom which was reported on 17 September 2021;

**WHEREAS**, Classical BSE is a zoonotic disease which may pose a risk to consumers due to its link with the variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob disease (vCJD) in humans;

**WHEREAS**, Section 10 of Republic Act no. 10611, or the "Food Safety Act of 2013", provided that in specific circumstances when the available relevant information for use in risk assessment is insufficient to show that a certain type of food or food product does not pose a risk to consumer health, **precautionary measures** shall be adopted;

**NOW, THEREFORE, I, WILLIAM D. DAR**, Secretary, Department of Agriculture, by the powers vested in me by law, do hereby institute the following measures for the importation of meat and meat by products derived from cattle from the United Kingdom:

- 1. Temporary suspension of the processing, evaluation of the application and issuance of the Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Import Clearance of meat and meat by products derived from cattle including live cattle importation;
- All shipments IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT before the official communication of this Order to the British Authorities shall be allowed provided the slaughter and production date is on or before August 31, 2021;
- 3. All previously approved SPS Import Clearances which were not yet IN TRANSIT/LOADED/ACCEPTED UNTO PORT after the official communication of this Order to the British Authorities are hereby REVOKED;
- 4. Shipments with ship out date after the communication of this Order to the British Authorities shall be dealt with as per DA Administrative Order 9 series of 2010, Section VII.D;
- 5. More rigorous and tight inspection on all arrivals of meat and meat by-products derived from cattle including live cattle by DA Veterinary Quarantine Officers assigned at ports of entry.

This ORDER shall take effect immediately.
