

## 4 DESCRIPTION OF GOOD

# "ULMA CONSTRUCTION FORMWORKS EQUIPMENT"

Based on the brochure and technical specifications submitted, subject article is a system of moulds used in forming concrete beams, columns, and wall panels in building construction. The system consists of lightweight panel formworks, timber beam slab formworks, steel props, shaft platforms, and accessories (such as tie rod, timber beam, and inside and outside corners). The moulds are assembled on-site to form the appropriate parts of the building structure. When the concrete hardens, the moulds are removed and can be used for other projects.

# 5 REASONS FOR CLASSIFICATION

Heading 84.80 of the ASEAN Harmonized Tariff Nomenclature (AHTN) 2017 covers, among others, moulds for metal (other than ingot moulds), metal carbides, glass, mineral materials, rubber or plastics. The pertinent Harmonized System (HS) Explanatory Notes (EN) state that in general, the essential function of a mould is to retain the material in a predetermined shape while it sets; some moulds also exert a certain pressure on the material. The heading includes, among others, moulds for moulding concrete, cement or asbestos-cement goods (tubes, vats, paving stones, flags, chimney-pots, bannisters, architectural ornaments, wall, floor or roof slabs, etc.). Also, moulds for making, prefabricated construction elements of reinforces or prestressed concrete (window frames, parts of vaulting beams, railway sleepers, etc.)

In view thereof, subject article is classified under AHTN 2017 subheading 8480.60.00, with a Most Favoured Nation (MFN) rate of duty of 1% ad valorem.

This ruling shall be valid for five (5) years from the date of issuance and shall continue to apply unless the law, facts, or circumstances supporting this ruling have changed.

#### 4 DESCRIPTION OF GOOD

#### "SHELL BITUMEN 100/300"

Based on the technical information and safety data sheet submitted, subject article is a component grade petroleum bitumen in the form of a black semi-solid. It has a penetration range of 100 dmm to 300 dmm. It is produced by blending different types of residues generated in Vacuum Units, Thermal Gasification Unit, and Lube Units petroleum refinery processes. To be imported in bulk, subject article will be processed further by blending with a harder raw material (bitumen component with lower penetration) to adjust its penetration level to the required specifications.

#### 5 REASONS FOR CLASSIFICATION

Heading 27.13 of the ASEAN Harmonized Tariff Nomenclature (AHTN) 2017 covers petroleum coke, petroleum bitumen and other residues of petroleum oils or of oils obtained from bituminous minerals. The pertinent Harmonized System (HS) Explanatory Notes (EN) state that petroleum bitumen (also known as petroleum pitch, refinery pitch, petroleum asphalt) is usually obtained as a residue of the distillation of crude petroleum. It is brown or black and may be soft or brittle. It is used for road-surfacing, waterproofing, etc. Petroleum bitumen which has been slightly modified by air-blowing is similar to unblown bitumen and remains in this heading.

In view thereof, subject article is classified under AHTN 2017 subheading 2713.20.00, with a Most Favoured Nation (MFN) rate of duty of zero and an ASEAN Trade in Goods Agreement (ATIGA) rate of duty of zero, subject to submission of Certificate of Origin (CO) Form "D".

This ruling shall be valid for five (5) years from the date of issuance and shall continue to apply unless the law, facts, or circumstances supporting this ruling have changed.
