Attached herein is the letter dated December 10, 2021 from Rosalina L. Tan, Officer-in-Charge, International Operations Department, Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) informing this office of the revised list of regulated and prohibited commodities under the FX Manual, as amended, pursuant to BSP Circular No. 1124 dated August 10, 2021 (which became effective on September 13, 2021) which only includes those involving the BSP, with the following details:
