COMMODITIES UNDER THE MANUAL OF REGULATIONS ON FOREIGN

EXCHANGE TRANSACTIONS (FX MANUAL), AS AMENDED

Attached herewith is the letter from Rosalina L. Tan, Officer-In-Charge, International Operations Department, Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (IOD-BSP) regarding the revised list of regulated and prohibited commodities under the Foreign Exchange Transactions (FX Manual), as amended, which only includes those involving the BSP. Pursuant to BSP Circular No. 1124 dated August 10, 2021 (which became effective on September 13, 2021), with details as follows:
