DECREE OF ABANDONMENT

WHEREAS, on 27 February 2020, Steve Francis Realuyo, AVP – Container Terminal Division, ATI, informed and requested the District Collector, Port of Manila, to process the abandonment of the abovementioned dilapidated containers located at the Container Yard of ATI;

WHEREAS, according to ATI these containers have been in their container yard for several years and are becoming a safety concern to moving equipment and vehicles. Thus, the request for abandonment of the same, in furtherance to the mutual objective to clear the port of overstaying containers;

WHEREAS, it can be presumed that the owners of the Seven (7) Dilapidated Containers located at the ATI Container Yard, have no intention to claim the same and are presumed abandoned pursuant to Section 1129 of the CMTA;

WHEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, the Seven (7) Dilapidated Containers bearing Container Nos. MAGU2312002, GESU6680656, NFHU1088485, ICSU6969225, TGHU3338961, YTLU2113363, and CAXU2306821, located at the Container Yard of Asian Terminals Inc., are hereby declared **ABANDONED** in favor of the government to be disposed of in the manner provided for by law.

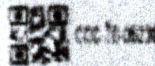
