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

Dear Commissioner Faeldon,



We have received a copy of a letter of the Chairman of Samahang Industriya ng Agrikultura (SINAG) Engineer Rosendo So, regarding the Disposal of the 32 containers of pork imports that will be rendered in Palayan City, Nueva Ecija. I believe that their concerns are legitimate and need to be resolved.

For an easier working relationship, I would appreciate if I can be given a copy of information relating to matters such as smuggling of agricultural products, rendering of abandoned agricultural products, and/or any information relating to agriculture/fisheries (rice, meat, poultry, sugar, onions and garlic, etc.). As Vice Chair of the Committee on Agriculture and Vice Chair of the Committee on Finance in Charge of Agriculture, these matters will help me in my legislative agenda. Smuggling as we all know not only unjustly expose local farmers to unfair competition, which eventually leads to the loss of millions of jobs for Filipinos, it also exposes the public to substandard and noxious products detrimental to our health.

RA 10845 or "The act declaring large-scale agricultural smuggling as economic sabotage" which I principally authored in the Senate and which was passed recently considers the smuggling of agricultural commodities and people caught engaging in smuggling and technical smuggling of goods worth P10 million or more for rice, and P1 million or more for other agricultural products, such as sugar, corn, high-value crops, poultry and livestock as economic sabotage and will be subjected under this law. The smugglers and their cohorts will be charged with life imprisonment and a fine of twice the fair value of their smuggled products, plus the aggregate amount of the taxes, duties and other charges avoided and the smuggled articles shall be confiscated.

Smuggling of agricultural products endangers the survival of the agriculture industry where most of the poor are. They are mainly in farming and fishing. It threaten the livelihood of small and subsistence farmers because the presence of smuggled products unjustly lowers market price, making it almost impossible for locally-produced goods to compete.





In this regard, I look forward to your cooperation.
