- 1. Member States shall provide a list of the names, addresses, specimen signatures and specimen of official seals of its issuing authorities, in hard copy and soft copy format, through the ASEAN Secretariat for dissemination to other Member States in soft copy format. Any change in the said list shall be promptly provided in the same manner.<sup>1</sup>
- 2. For the Philippines, specimen signatures and seals of authorized signatories of all Export Divisions or equivalent units are submitted to the Export Coordination Division for collation and transmittal to the Bureau of International Trade Relations of the Department of Trade and Industry who subsequently transmits the same to the ASEAN Secretariat for circulation among ASEAN member states. Said specimen signatures and seals are always treated with confidentiality.
- 3. However, it came to our knowledge that some Export Divisions are providing copies of their specimen signatures and seals to stakeholders. This practice is discouraged to avoid questionable Certificates of Origin.
- 4. As agreed in the negotiation rounds of all Free Trade Agreements, specimen signatures and seals must course through proper government authorities.
- 5. In any case that the issued Certificate of Origin have been in question at the importing country, the matter must be communicated directly to Export Coordination Division.
- 6. For strict compliance.
