WARRANT OF SEIZURE AND DETENTION

GREETINGS:

WHEREAS, a parcel with Tracking No. CP918401746PL stc: Cosmetics Set +35 Ladies, arrived at Surface Mail Exchange Department (SMED) on 14 February 2025, from Przernystaw Jagoda of Sejmowa 5A/11, 59-220 Legnica, Poland;

WHEREAS, on 24 February 2025, the assigned customs examiner together with XIP, PhilPost – SMED, CIIS, ESS-CAIDTF and PDEA representatives conducted physical examination of the subject parcel and was found to actually contain Two (2) Lemur Mask, Two (2) Leopard Mask, Two (2) Hedgehog Mask, One (1) Panda Mask, One (1) Make-Up Removal Wipes, Twenty-Seven (27) Assorted Candies labeled as Cuit, Four (4) Self Sealing Foil Pouch labeled as Amber Bath Salt containing more or less Three Hundred Thirty-Seven (337) Grams of Off-White Crystal;

WHEREAS, upon confirmatory test conducted by PDEA on even date, the samples taken were positive for the presence of 4-chloromethcathinone, as evidenced by Chemistry Report No. PDEA-NCR-25-0054 issued by Atty. Severino P. Uy, Jr., RCh, Chief, Examination Division;

WHEREAS, in a Memorandum dated 03 March 2025, Pauline P. Rodriguez, COO III, Customs Postal Office, recommended the issuance of a Warrant of Seizure and Detention (WSD) against the subject parcel pursuant to Section 119(d) of the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA), in relation to R.A. 9165 otherwise known as the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drug Act of 2002";



WHEREAS, in a 1st Indorsement dated 03 March 2025, Leah J. Aquino, Acting Port Collector, Customs Postal Office, forwarded to the District Collector, Port of Manila, the documents bearing the assigned customs examiner's recommendation for issuance of a WSD against the subject parcel;

WHEREAS, the foregoing circumstances show the existence of probable cause for the issuance of a WSD pursuant to Sections 118 and 119(d) of the Customs Modernization and Tariff Act (CMTA), in relation to R.A. 9165 otherwise known as the "Comprehensive Dangerous Drug Act of 2002";

WHEREAS, the articles/items are presently stored at Surface Mail Exchange Department (SMED) under the custody of the assigned customs examiner;

WHEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me by law, and in compliance with pertinent Customs laws, rules and regulations, you, together with the representative of this office, are hereby ordered to forthwith seize the aforementioned articles and turn them over to the custody to the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency (PDEA) pursuant to Sec. 21, R.A. 9165 otherwise known as "Comprehensive Dangerous Drugs Act 2022", in relation to Section 1147(d) of the CMTA, CAO No. 10-2020 and CAO No. 3-2019, particularly on the matter of making a return of service and the submission of the inventory report or list of the article/s seized is to be strictly observed and finally, you are hereby ordered to return the aforesaid Warrant within twenty-four (24) hour from service, to the Law Division, this Port. Failure to do so, the Warrant shall ipso facto be considered null and void.

Greetings!

This refers to your letter dated March 6, 2025 addressed to IA I Rossana D. San Miguel, which this Office received on March 7, 2025.

There are two (2) issues raised in your letter dated March 6, 2025. The first issue involves providing you with immediate inspection results on the daily paneling and K9 sweeping of parcels at SMED prior to dispatching to the concerned stations. In connection with this, this Office, through the Seaport Interdiction Unit-Port of Manila (SIU-POM) lead by IA I Rossana D. San Miguel, will provide you with the certified true copy of the After Activity Report every after paneling and K9 sweeping, once available.

On the second issue, there appears to be a misunderstanding since what this Office is referring to that should be turned over to the PDEA are the following:

a. Dangerous drugs;

Receptacle where the dangerous drugs are hidden;

c. Other illegal objects that may be used as proof of the commission of the offense; and

d. Shipment/parcel importation documents.

As of this date, this Office has not yet refused any turnover of non-drug evidence from your Office. Non-drug evidence refers to those that were **not** part of the receptacle where the dangerous drug was discovered or found.

This pertains to our urgent need to address matters that are essential in the exercise of border control to prevent entry of smuggled goods, problems and issues relative to the interdiction of dangerous drugs imported, exported from or transshipped into the Philippine territory.

For transparency, effective and efficient implementation of MOA between BOC and PDEA pursuant to Customs Memorandum Circular No. 42-2019 dated 08 February 2019 and in promoting a drug free workplace, may we kindly be provided immediately of the inspection result (positive or negative) of your daily paneling and K9 sweeping of parcels at SMED prior to dispatching to concerned stations.

Another issue is, with the recent circumstances of intercepted drugs duly witnessed by other authorized representatives at SMED, may this Office be informed of the legal basis for refusal to receive non-drug items under your custody.

May we respectfully request for your cooperation and immediate response to our concern not later than March 07, 2025.







Ms. Geraldine Pimentel, Parcel Section Personnel, presented a parcel to me, informing me
that it was inside a mail bag that appeared to have been tampered with or opened by CMEC
X-ray without breaking the seal.

It was also said the parcel have a weight discrepancy issue.

The parcel was left by Ms. Pimentel on the table at the Bureau of Customs examination area.

Noticing that it had an X marking, I advised that the parcel undergo a K-9 inspection.

• Since there was no official incident report and there was already a gap in the timeline of its handling, I refused to accept the parcel.

 I instructed Ms. Pimentel to file an incident report for proper documentation and resolution while waiting for PDEA to conduct the K-9 inspection.

Photos of the parcel is attached for reference.

Follow-up Action:

- On February 24, 2025, at approximately 1426H, the parcel was lined up for PDEA K-9 inspection.
- The inspection confirmed a positive indication for dangerous drugs.
- I immediately reported the incident to the Acting Port Collector.




